Enrichment design checklist



Use this checklist to make sure your enrichment item is appropriate for the animal in question.

This checklist is based on the one our zoo keepers use. You should be able to answer NO to all questions.



If swallowed, could it cause choking, intoxication or impaction?

Will it break/deteriorate easily?

Could the animal get entangled/trapped in it, causing constriction, injury or death?

Can it chip or break the animal's teeth, bill or beak?

Could it be used to break containment?

Can it be used as a weapon by an animal?

Does it include any nailing twine or other plastic string?

Can it damage the enclosure?

Will it cause the animal to avoid their diet?

Can it cause competition or aggression between different animals in the same enclosure?

Could it cause excessive stress?

If it is for birds, does it have brittle plastics, soft toys, rubber, cello tape or CDs?

Could it cause an animal not to recall? (Recall is when keepers call animals to their off-display dens – used in emergencies)

Will it be overly difficult to retrieve or clean up?

Does it have any staples, tape, or other small bits that could be hazardous to the animals?

Design your own enclosure
